

# Resurfacing History: Land and Lives in Mount Pleasant

---

The project focuses on developing a community process for promoting understanding between cultural value systems, and to build capacity for Aboriginal people to be part of a mechanism that preserves culture, explores knowledge and integrates actionable steps that can make social ecosystems and infrastructure work for the urban Aboriginal families and community members.

## What will it look like?

Cultural Facilitators will participate in land based learning. Indigenous Plant Diva Cease Wyss will train participants to harvest, preserve, and understand properties of indigenous plants.

Facilitators will share what they learn at community groups. They will work with the community to develop a plan that identifies how to support cultural continuity for Aboriginal people who live in urban centers, while respecting Coast Salish Territory

With help from Bruce Macdonald, Vancouver historian, we will invite community experts together to inform future planning to protect and boost the natural life in Mount Pleasant, including a culture of respecting Indigenous knowledge and land.
